Ken Pearson and Mark Horridge continue to be involved in software development and in GTAP training courses; this will be covered by the Director.

Together with members of the Department of Economics at Chulalongkorn University, Philip Adams and Mark Horridge have studied the *long-run effects of AFTA* on the Thai economy. To interface their GTAP results with the national CAMGEM model of Thailand they have used the top-down methodology of Adams, Huff, McDougall, Pearson and Powell (see

http://www.monash.edu.au/policy/ftp/workpapr/g-111.pdf). The GTAP results are reported in the companion paper (copy herewith) by Adams and Horridge. The CAMGEM results from the interfaced simulation are to be reported by the Chulalongkorn team (led by Kwanjai Arunsmith).
